### Pastor's Note

Luke 24 But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. 2 They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3 but when they went in, they did not find the body.[a] 4 While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. 5 The women[b] were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men[c] said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen.[d] 6 Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, 7 that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." 8 Then they remembered his words, 9 and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. 10 Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. 11 But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. 12 But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.[e]

We are people of the resurrection. I don't know about you, but there are days that I need to be reminded of that truth. Days when I feel just like the disciples, terrified about what is before me, unable to see the way out or through, let alone new possibilities in the midst of old realities. And yet, that so often times is how God works; in surprising and unexpected ways to pull us out of the familiar, into a new way of seeing and experience the world.

I just talked with an old friend about this very thing. We talked at length about the difficulty of seeing something new in the midst of the death of something long known and beloved. Yet, having just gone through a huge transition in her life, one that involved deep grieving, not unlike the women who went to the tomb, she has been amazed at how God has worked in and through the chaos to make things new. And things are different, that is sure - but it has lead to rich blessings and new life - and it is good.

The disciples that arrived at the tomb on that first day of the week had a firm vision in their mind of what they were going to encounter. It would take a gentle reminder from the angels for them to remember who Jesus was and what he had told them. That reminder opened their minds to see newest in the midst of death - newest that would ultimately lead to a deeper journey of faith and a life which embodied their new identity and calling.

Maybe that is what we need too; to be reminded of who and what Jesus is and how his life, sacrifice and teaching form and shape our lives. Maybe that reminder is what we need before we can begin the hard work of thinking about how we should be living as disciples of the risen Lord, and how it is that we come together to do the work of Christ's church.

I will be doing just that as we walk towards the empty tomb, thinking deeply about how my faith invites me to see new possibilities in the midst of what I have always know. My prayer is that you will join with me in this practice of Examen and open yourselves us to new possibilities.

# FINANCIAL UPDATE



Your Finance Committee provides the following update on our finances.

Our 2018 Expense Budget was \$173,063. The 2019 Expense Budget that we prepared, presented to Session, and was approved by Session on Dec. 18, 2018, was \$176,174 which was an increase of \$3,111 over the 2018 Expense Budget.

After many hours put forth on reviewing our 2019 Expense Budget and our estimated income for 2019, we knew that our expenses had to be reduced. In early March, we prepared a REVISED 2019 Expense Budget and presented it to Session. This revised budget reduced our 2019 expenses by \$10,386 and put our 2019 Expense Budget at \$165,788. The Session approved this revised budget on March 5, 2019, at a Special Session Meeting called for the purpose of reviewing and approving our revised Expense Budget. It should be noted that this reduction in the 2019 budget put the new budget at \$7,275 below our 2018 budget.

We thank all who stepped forward, when presented with the financial concerns for 2019, and helped us to relieve some of our income decline. We are grateful to all who prayerfully considered their giving to our church and provided some additional income for us.

Your Finance Committee felt that additional trimming should be done, and could be done in certain areas. A few budget line items were referred back to committees responsible for those line items so that recommendations could be presented to the Finance Committee. Based on those recommendations, your Finance Committee prepared a second REVISED Expense Budget for 2019 and presented it to the Session at the Regular Session Meeting on March 19, 2019. This second revised budget reduced our 2019 expenses by an additional \$4,051, and put our 2019 Expense Budget at \$161,737. The Session approved this second revision to our budget. It should also be noted that this second reduction in the 2019 budget put the new budget at \$11,326 below our 2018 budget.

These expense reductions have not been easy decisions to make, but are necessary. Your Finance Committee and the entire Session are doing their best to be good stewards of the resources we are given and relying on God to give us direction. Much prayerful consideration has gone in to making these reductions. When looking at our estimated income for 2019 and our budgeted expenses for 2019, we are by no means "out of the woods", but we are in much better shape after making additional reductions in expenses than we were 2 months ago.

As of March 21<sup>st</sup>, our year-to-date income is \$38,450 with year-to-date expenses totaling \$37,364. As of March 21<sup>st</sup>, our income for the month of March is \$11,475 with expenses for March totaling \$7,343. When looking at our \$161,737 Expense Budget for the year, we need income of \$13,478 per month to cover the expenses.

Your Finance Committee and entire Session will continue to be prudent with the resources we are given and our expenses. We will continue to keep you updated on our finances and ask that your prayers include our work concerning the finances of our church. #### **NEWS FROM CHRISTIAN ED COMMITTEE**

For the month of March, we had fewer 559 gatherings. March 6<sup>th</sup>, we had no regular 559 because it was Ash Wednesday. The youth were encouraged to attend the service, and all were accounted for in regular attendance. During the event, the younger children received a craft, which consisted of 40 paper chains that they printed a name on, the purpose being, to pray for one person or family per day during the season of Lent. The middle school and high school, who also had the opportunity to make a prayer chain, participated in the service by reading scripture.

There was no 559 on the 27<sup>th</sup> due to Spring Break.

The remaining two weeks of 559, the younger group spent time looking back on the Ash Wednesday service and working on a Resurrection Story Wheel. The Senior group began watching a Netflix movie on the gospel of Luke. This movie presents, word-for-word, the bible text of the entire book of Luke, which is narrated and re-enacted, as the producers recreate, as authentically as possible, the background where it took place. This movie is part of the Lumo project, that created movies for each of the gospels, and is another way to encounter the message of the gospel!

#### OUR OFFERINGS AT WORK.

#### PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (PDA)

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is the emergency and refugee program of the Presbyterian church (U.S.A.). It enables our congregations and mission partners to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic event. find an interactive world map with OGHS recipients at www.pcusa.org/oghsmap.

#### International aid:

In the first half of 2017, 20 countries received aid and support after catastrophic events, including the Super Typhoon Mangkhut in the Philippines, China and surrounding areas; emergency response following earthquakes and a tsunami in Indonesia; flooding in India; volcanic eruption in Guatemala, violence and famine in South Sudan; and ongoing assistance for refugees and internally displaced persons related to Syria.

#### National Aid:

28 states received help following natural and human-caused disasters, including flooding in Montana, Ohio, Maryland, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Hawaii and more; tornadoes in Alabama, Virginia and Iowa; wildfires in California, and Colorado; ongoing response to Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria as well as Superstorm Sandy and Hurricane Matthew; and various public violence incidents.

#### Fall 2017 Hurricanes:

PDA has established a three-year \$10.4 million budget for Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria. as of august 1, 2018, over \$2,500,000 in grants have been disbursed; 2,743 PDA volunteers served disaster impacted communities in Texas, Florida and Puerto Rico through PDA — supported host sites; 50 deployments of 132 National response Team members totaling more than 1,000 days in the field.

#### Syria:

With the support of PDA, the National evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon has opened five schools in Syrian refugee camps, which are hosting over 300 students. Homes in Homs are being rebuilt so that displaced families who fled their embattled city can return to begin the hard work of rebuilding their shattered city and broken neighborhoods.

#### South Sudan:

PDA is working with Presbyterian relief and development agency, the humanitarian arm of the Presbyterian church of South Sudan, to provide large-scale emergency relief projects for South Sudanese displaced persons and refugees, as well as supporting livelihood and food security, peace building, and education for civil society.
