Beloved in Christ,

I have heard it said that as we age, time seems to move more quickly. I am just beginning to realize how true that statement is! As I have begun to move from one season of my life to the next, it feels like, besides God, the only consistent thing that I can rely upon with certainty is **change!** While I am usually not opposed to it, I have to admit some days I find myself, even as one who dislikes routines, wishing that things would slow down so I could establish one. But even with my lament comes blessing, because I have noticed that when I spend time in prayer and reflection, the presence of God's gentle and guiding hand becomes clearer.

For many, the world around us seems to be moving at a fast pace, one that is increasingly divided. That division has created intolerance, rigidity, and a form of self-righteousness (an unfounded certainty that one is totally correct and morally superior) that has created huge chasms in the fabric of our world and communities. As I lament the changes that I have seen taking place through the years, one thing becomes clear to me - and that is - if I am going to be a small pebble of change in the world around me - I have to.... have to.... ground myself in prayer.

Prayer has the power to bring about change - and by that, I don't mean that we offer our laments and concerns to God and leave it at that. But that in and through our prayers, we not only pray for the needs of the world around us, but pray that God will CHANGE US and USE us, to be agents of change in a world so in need of love, peace, humility, and kindness. As disciples of Christ, we have been giving the responsibility to share these gifts with the world around us. It is a challenge to be sure - and that is where personal change can help.

As we walk the short season between Epiphany and the season of Lent, I invite you to focus more intentionally on your prayer life and open yourself up to where God is leading you. My prayer is that you might discover how God might be inviting you to be a small pebble of change in God's world here and now.

SOUND SYSTEM

You may have noticed in the past month or so that we have been having trouble with our sound system. As a result, members of the Session worked with Tegeler Music to discover what had gone awry. Happily, it was discovered that it was a matter of pushing the correct buttons!

During their visit however, we were reminded of something that was on our radar, which is of the upcoming change in FCC guidelines regarding rules for frequencies used with wireless mics. Unfortunately, it means that we will no longer be able to use our current headset or lapel mic as of June of this year.

The Session voted on January 21, 2020, to replace one lapel and one headset with a new 10 channel digital system, which includes one lapel mic and one headset, the cost of which is \$1348.00. The good news is that we will receive a small rebate (\$50-\$75) for each of the obsolete units we turn it.

We are letting you know this in the hopes that a few of you might like to contribute to the cost of these new units. If you have any questions, please speak with Dale Thayer.


