Rice and Beans Go a LONG Way in Haiti!

As a congregation, we are working to provide peanut butter, jelly, chips, and other lunch items to feed children in our community who will be getting free lunches this summer. Once again, the Outreach committee would like to challenge the congregation to help feed the children and families of Mission Starfish Haiti as well. During the summer months when school is not in session, the students do not get the daily hot meal that they get during the school year. Many families struggle to provide even a single meal a day of rice and/or beans.

ONE 50-pound bag of rice (costing about \$20) will feed a family of five for about 18 days!!

ONE 50-pound bag of beans (costing about \$35) lasts a family of five for about 48 days. There are approximately 48 cups of beans in each bag and a daily serving is only one-fifth of a cup per person!

School at Mission Starfish Haiti will be out through September, so we will be collecting monetary donations from June through August and sending that money on to Mission Starfish Haiti periodically over the summer. Our RICE AND BEANS drive will kick off on Sunday, June 2nd. We hope that you will help provide nutrition during the summer months for Mission Starfish Haiti students and their families.

FINANCIAL UPDATE





Your Finance Committee provides the following update on our finances. We had another good month in April. We received \$6,563.26 more than our expenses were. One of our families gave their entire pledge for the year during the month of April which greatly increased our income for the month. We must remember that that was a one-time donation and we must make it last the rest of the year. For the first 4 months of this year we have received \$68,557,46 of income and had \$62,362.98 in expenses.

Our parking lot was repaved and striped the week of May 13th. The bill for this work was \$72,600.00. On May 24th, Mike Hand and Dale Thayer, President and Treasurer of the corporation (respectively), met with Community State Bank to finalize the paperwork for the loan for the parking lot work. The amount of the parking lot loan is \$72,677.00 which includes \$65.00 for document fees and \$12.00 for Flood Certification.

As of May 24th, our loan payments for the parking lot loan will be \$594.13 per month commencing July 5, 2019. The interest rate is 5.4% until June 5, 2024 which is the maturity date of the loan.

As of May 24th, our mortgage payments will be \$661.67 per month commencing on July 5, 2019. This is a reduction of \$985.90 per month in our monthly payment for the mortgage. The interest rate is 4.5% until November 1, 2020, and will then be adjusted to a rate of 5.4% until June 5, 2024, which is the balloon date of the parking lot loan. Our current balance on the mortgage is \$60,913.34.

Our COMBINED payments for the mortgage AND the parking lot loan are now \$1,255.80 due the 5th day of each month commencing with the July 5, 2019 payment. This is \$391.77 LESS than we were paying per month on just our mortgage. No payment for the mortgage is due in June this year. On May 28th, both payments were set up at the bank for automatic transfer from the church checking account with Dale Thayer, Corporation Treasurer, signing the Automatic Transfer Authorization forms for both loans. On the 5th day of each month \$661.67 will be automatically transferred from the checking account to the payment for the mortgage, and on the same day each month \$594.13 will be automatically transferred from the checking account to the parking lot loan.

We are continuing to keep a close watch on our expenses and be good stewards of our resources. We are continually looking at ways that we can reduce expenses. We give thanks to all who have helped in any way to control our expenses and have helped with increasing our income. Praise God for such a wonderful congregation!!
