# Pastor's Note May 2019

I will lead the blind by a road they do not know, by paths they have not known I will guide them. I will turn the darkness before them into light, the rough places into level ground. These are the things I will do, and I will not forsake them Isaiah 42:16

Easter was late this year, at least it felt late to me. Maybe it was because the winter seemed so long that I became convinced that spring would never arrive. I think this year was particularly hard for me because of the obvious lack of light in my home. My former home in Michigan had an over abundance of light which seemed to help keep at bay the darkness of spirit that the winter months can sometimes bring. For some reason the lack of light affected me more this year that my two previous winters in Illinois/Iowa.

For me, the bottom line is, I need light. I suspect that most of us do. Its obvious presence or lack there of can and does affect our moods, our outlook, our entire approach to the day, and at times life. God knows this, which is why there are over 200 references to light (depending on the translation) in the bible -and why God provided the Light of the World - for us. Christ's light shines as a beacon during times of darkness and despair, and it also shines a light on the suffering, injustice, brokenness and darkness in the lives of others and invites us to partner with God on the Holy mission of reconciliation.

There is a hymn written by Bernadette Farrell called *Christ Be Our Light*, that I so like the words of. They remind me of Christ's constant presence in my life, not only as a beacon of hope in my times of darkness - but that I am called to be a beacon of light, for Christ, in the midst of the world's darkness to others.

# FINANCIAL UPDATE

Your Finance Committee provides the following update on our finances. We had 2 good months. In February we received \$1,153 more than our expenses. In March we received \$3,018 more than our expenses. However, our expenses in January were \$4,350 more than our income. When comparing all 3 months, we had \$45,387 in income and \$45,567 in expenses which put us \$180 more in expenses than our income was for the first 3 months this year. We are moving in the right direction in controlling our budget.

Some of you may have heard that we signed a new contract for a new copy machine for our office. The obvious question is "How can we afford that with our budget situation?" We actually save money in doing so, as explained below.

Our old machine was through Office Machine Consultants in Rock Island and we had 1 year left on the 5-year lease agreement. For the year of 2018 we paid an average of \$240 per month which was \$139.50 for the lease plus a cost per copy for black copies and a different cost per copy for color copies.

A sales representative from Access Systems in Davenport stopped in our office and presented a proposal for one of their new machines and showed us that we could save some money with a new machine. We contacted Office Machine Consultants and told them we were contacted by another company and received a proposal from that company for a new machine, and asked what they could do for us in order for us to stay with their company. (We have been with them for approximately 15 years.)

Office Machine Consultants gave us a proposal for a new machine with their proposal being a more favorable proposal than Access Systems. The Finance Committee reviewed the proposals from both companies and our usage/costs for 2018, and then presented their recommendation to Session on April 9<sup>th</sup> that we lease the new machine on a 5-year lease agreement from Office Machine Consultants. The new machine from Office Machine Consultants decreases our average monthly costs (based on the 2018 average monthly fees) to \$179 per month which is \$135 for the lease plus a cost per copy for black copies and a different cost per copy for color copies. The big difference is that the new lease agreement gives us a much lower cost per copy for both black copies and color copies. The cost per copy under the new agreement is about ½ the cost per copy under the old agreement. Additionally, the new machine is capable of stapling and folding to make booklets which will save Paul valuable time. The Session approved the Finance Committee's recommendation for the new machine. This new machine gives us an average savings per month of \$60.61 compared to our old machine (\$727.32 savings for a full year).

The Finance Committee and the full Session believed that if we could save over \$700 for the year with the new machine, now was right time to upgrade and stay with Office Machine Consultants who has given us very good service over the last 15 years. **BOTTOM LINE: This was another reduction in expenses that we were able to achieve PLUS gain improved technology at a lower cost!** 

We are continuing to very carefully control our expenses and be good stewards of the resources we are given. We are continually looking at ways that we can reduce expenses. With God's guidance and your prayers, we are slowly moving in the right direction with thoughtful, prayerful, detailed decisions.
